**▶ CLINIC INFORMATION:**

The "Intro to Ranch Horse" clinic is a two-day, two-clinician clinic. Riders work in a rotating format and cover reining and cattle work. Reining portion covers circles, stops, speed control, lead changes, and spins. The cow work covers reading cattle, working position, and correct turns. Skills are suitable for reined cow horse, versatility, ranch horse, and work skills at home. Both portions work towards softness and control.

**Austin Grazier, Reining...**

Austin trains outside of Manhattan, Montana, at the Gallatin River Ranch. Austin grew up on a small boarding and training facility in Colorado. Throughout High School Austin was actively competing in Cowboy Mountain Shooting and most notably won the **2014 Cowboy Mounted Shooting Assn AQHA Youth World Champion**. Although he loved mounted shooting, Austin was always more interested in developing a more trained and finished horse which led him to the reining and reined cow horse worlds. Over the last seven years he has worked with Bozeman area trainer, Jess Holloway, and 'Run For The Million' judge and non-pro coach, Ben Balow.



**Tim Unzicker, Cow Work...**

Tim lives and trains outside of Roundup, Montana. He has been training for over 35 years and earned over \$250,000 in NRCHA, NRHA, & AQHA shows. He has been a finalist in every NRCHA major event and was the Reno Snaffle Bit Futurity Open Bridle Champion in 2006; NRCHA Stallion Stakes Intermediate Open Reserve Champion in 2009; and placed 6<sup>th</sup> in the NRCHA's World's Greatest Horseman in 2008.
